2015 RECYCLING GUIDE

Access permitted only for Upper Pittsgrove Township residents for disposal of normal household trash and recyclables.

Permit/Decals

A green Convenience Center permit decal must be placed on the rear view mirror or front bumper of all vehicles. Decals may be purchased for \$1.00 at the Municipal Building. You will need to show the vehicle registration card with valid address. Renters may receive 1 permit with proof of residency (lease or bill) and vehicle registration card.

Businesses/Institutions

Businesses are required to recycle and must turn in a recycling report to the township annually. Business recyclables are accepted at the Convenience Center, no trash/garbage.

Keep our Community Clean!

Please use closed bags and containers to transport trash. Open-bed trucks or trailers must be covered by a tarp. Free tarps are available at the Convenience Center!

The Salem County Solid Waste Facility is an alternative site available for residents to dispose of materials for a fee. Hours for county residents are Wednesdays and Saturdays, 8:00 am–4:00 pm. In addition they host Hazardous Waste Collection Days and Paper Shredding Events:

Recycling is Mandatory!

Recyclables must be separated from normal household trash and placed in the appropriate containers. Employees may randomly slice trash bags to ensure compliance.

Recycled – Free



Aluminum Cans - Beverage cans only. All other aluminum cans (cat food, etc.) go in the Scrap Metal container.

Anti-Freeze - Collect separately in a clean unbreakable container with tight-fitting lid. Do not mix with any other liquid.

Bi-Metal Cans - Rinse and remove labels.

Cardboard - Corrugated cardboard must be flattened and kept dry. Wax coated or food contaminated boxes go in the trash. Pizza boxes are accepted with food residue removed.

Clothing/Shoes – Salvation Army box.

Concrete & Asphalt - Concrete, block, and bricks should be separated from asphalt.

Dry Cell Batteries -Lead-acid car and truck batteries and all rechargeable NiMH/lithium batteries (AAA, AA, D, C) are recyclable. Alkaline batteries should be placed in the trash.

Electronics – Consumer electronics and small household appliances; anything with a cord: TV's, computers, laptops, monitors, game consoles, cell phones/chargers, vacuums, stereos, DVD & video players, lamps, etc.

Glass (Clear, Green, & Brown) – Glass bottles only; Rinse and remove lids and caps.

Place in trash: *ceramics, flat glass, mirrors, window glass, and Pyrex, Corning or other glass cooking pots or dishes.*



Lumber – Includes non-pressure treated lumber, wood scraps, and pallets.

Motor Oil - Collect used oil separately in clean unbreakable container with tight-fitting lid. Do not mix with any other liquid.

Paper – Keep dry: office paper, junk mail, newspapers, magazines, and paper boxes. No plastic bags or liners.



Plastic - Plastic stamped with a symbol of #1 through #7 are recyclable. Containers must be empty and clean.



Scrap Metal - Includes miscellaneous scrap metal items like bikes, grills, screens, and plastic coated aluminum cans (like cat food cans).

Recycled – Fee Required

Construction Material - Small loads of household materials are accepted but you **must obtain a dumpster** for large projects and any load above 500 lbs. The SCIA also accepts construction debris for a fee.
Small load (200-500 lbs)..... \$30.00/load
Large loads (>500 lbs)..... Not accepted

Large Appliances - Do not damage refrigerant tubing.
Refrigerators, stoves, washers, dryers, and air conditioners..... \$5.00 each

Propane Tanks
Small (Under 20lbs)..... \$2.00 each
Regular (20lbs ONLY)..... \$5.00 each
Large (Over 20lbs)..... \$21.00 each

Tires
Auto/Truck up to 16" w/rim..... \$4.00 each
without rim..... \$3.00 each
Auto/Truck 17" & over w/rim\$18.00 each
without rim..... \$12.00 each
Industrial..... \$60.00 each

Other



Brush and Tree Limbs - Dispose by backyard composting or take to the SCIA. The township provides free chipping services in April and October. Call the Public

Works Dept. (358-0466) and leave a message with your name and address. This service is for normal seasonal trimming of trees and shrubs with a diameter 3 inches or less. Place brush on the edge of the road with cut ends facing the road.

Leaves, Grass, Other

Vegetative Material – Live Christmas trees are recycled at the Convenience Center

during the month of January. All other vegetative material must be disposed by backyard composting or taken to the SCIA for recycling. Leaves, grass clippings, hay, garden remnants, and kitchen scraps (no bones or meat) make a great compost for your yard and garden. The SCIA has plastic composter bins available at a great price.

Light Bulbs – Regular bulbs go in the trash. **Fluorescent bulbs (including CFLs) must be taken to the Household Hazardous Waste collection days or returned to the vendor.**

Paint – Latex and water-based paint cans go in the trash. No liquid - liquid must be dried in the can. **Oil based paints, solvents, thinners, varnish, and turpentine must go to Household Hazardous Waste Days.**

Prescription Medication – The Woodstown State Police barracks on Route 40 has a drop box for medications in original containers; no liquids. For questions about this program call 856-769-0775.
